

ARGUMENT IN FAVOR OF MEASURE N

Measure N requires strict fiscal accountability, transparency, and local control:

- All Measure N funds would stay in San Ramon. The State cannot touch one penny.
- Independent oversight, annual audits, and public spending disclosure.
- Voter approval will be required to renew Measure N after 10 years.

By law, essential purchases like groceries and prescription medications WON'T be taxed. Visitors of San Ramon will pay their fair share, so residents don't have to shoulder the entire cost.
